Minutes of the Leonard Stanley Parish Council Meeting held on Tuesday 1st September 2015 at 7.30 pm in the Village Hall.

66/15. Apologies for absence was received from Cllrs Stuart Craddock and Steve Lydon

67/15. Declarations of Interest in Agenda Items

There were none.

68/15. To approve the minutes from the Parish Council Meeting held on Tuesday 7th July 2015

The minutes were approved and signed as a true record.

69/15. To receive an update / reports from the County and District Councillors

County and District Cllr Steve Lydon sent in a report to Members which was circulated prior to the meeting. (Please see Appendix 1).

District Cllr Nigel Studdert Kennedy reported:-

- Work in Mankley Road is to commence early September.
- There is a new depot for Waste Collection, working jointly with other Councils.
- Stroud District Council have announced the changes to their Waste Collection Service.

70/15. Playing Fields:-

i) To receive a report (from the Playing Field Committee) on the drainage issues and decide what action if any to take).

A report was circulated to the Members prior to the meeting.

The drainage lines were clearly visible over the summer and these have been marked out. The Council therefore believe that the problems on the field are more likely to be wear and tear but felt it was still prudent to continue with an assessment. (See also 71/15iii)

The Football Club have temporarily moved the football pitch, the Members would like this moved back when possible to prevent deterioration to other parts of the field.

It was agreed that the Playing Field Committee and a representative from the Football Club should meet with Sports Ground Maintenance to review the repairs and agree any further remedial work.

ii) To confirm that all repairs, maintenance or alterations to the Playing Fields be agreed by the Parish Council prior to any work commencing and remain under their direct control.

The Council were unanimous in agreeing that all work on the Playing Fields should first be approved by them and then continue under their direct control.

iii) To receive an update on the Flood Lights

Cllr Connett circulated an email to the Members prior to the meeting informing them of what certification should be provided in relation to the erection and use of the Flood Lights.

Cllr Connett is to seek a quote from an independent electrician to carry out the 'Electrical Conditioning Report (ECR) 17th edition' on the Flood Lights when they are erected, to ensure that they meet the standards required for the certification. **CC**

The Members suggested that the costs of arranging the certification should be shared with the Football Club.

It was agreed that the Flood Lights can be erected but they can't be used until the Certificate has been issued.

The Council agreed to ask the Football Club if they could borrow a set of goal posts that are only used for the 6-aside tournament to be fixed into the ground by the Tennis Courts. (They would be returned for the tournament each year).

The Council would look to purchasing a set if this request was refused.

i. Village Green Application

The Mankley Field Action Group was successful in their bid to amend their application with Gloucestershire County Council and the Interested Parties signed a consent order. This has enabled new dates for the Inquiry to be agreed; it will now take place in the Village Hall from Monday the 7th December until Wednesday the 16th December 2015.

The Mankley Field Action Group would like to thank the following organisations for their recent generous donations; Kings Stanley Parish Council, Leonard Stanley Football Club and The Safari Supper. They also successfully raised £125 at the Village Fair and special thanks to Jan Bogdiukiewicz for supplying the snow machine.

The Action Group have recently launched a Justice Crowd Funding site, to enable further funds, which if successful will be used to retain the services of the specialist solicitor in addition to the barrister.

The gate has been installed. Signs for 'no climbing' and 'fragile roof' have been ordered. Locks will also be added.

Appendix 1

Cllr Steve Dursley County Cllr Steve Lydon Report

August 2015

Planning

The primary responsibility for planning for housing lies with the District Council. On matters to do with roads and highways, the County Council is the formal consultee with ref to giving a view on the proposals ie are they to be supported or opposed, following national guidance. Evidence shows that despite their being many controversial proposals coming forward particularly from a traffic increase/congestion view, that the County Council has rarely given an adverse view ie indicated they are not supportive of the application. I have approached SDC to ask them to consider taking independent advice on highways matters, rather than just rely on the County view. GCC are also being approached on their approach. The Local Plan consultation finishes in early Sept. there does not appear to be any substantive issues coming forward, to prevent the plan coming forward to be signed off by full council in November.

Devolution

Devolution of spending powers from central government to combined authorities of local public bodies is a current hot topic. The government are keen to push ahead with devolution and in the July budget there was further progress on devolving powers to Greater Manchester, which is the lead authority for devolution, including putting fire services under the control of a future directly-elected mayor, and granting the city region more powers over planning. At the recent LGA conference some councillors wondered whether devolution was more a decentralisation of pain given the expected further financial cuts to local councils. The LGA has forecast that with the expected scale of reductions many councils will find it difficult to cope while upholding care for the elderly, protection for children, bin collection and pothole repair. However devolution of powers will give local public bodies the opportunity to manage their own spending according to local needs. The government will only devolve powers to structures that reflect the local economy. Several areas of the country have or are now drawing up proposals for combined authorities, mostly in city regions although Cornwall is being considered as a rural area. Stroud District Council held a seminar in June at which councillors from Nottinghamshire described the joint bid from that county and Derbyshire for a combined authority. A statement of intent has been sent to government from Gloucestershire leaders from Given the opportunities and considering the advantages of an early application, in the last two months the Leadership members have agreed that Gloucestershire should apply to form a combined authority – some districts more readily than others. Unlike other areas Gloucestershire has no problems with who should be members of the authority since all the public bodies involved – local councils, LEP, CCG and Police - lie within the same county boundary. A combined authority has the major advantage over the economic growth committee in that both primary care and community safety could be sensibly linked to economic growth.

Highways

There are still problems with timescales and communications ie if or when work will be completed. Ryeford Bridge is having a variety of options being drawn up, the stream undercutting the road at Stanley Downton has been passed to Amey for the work to be undertaken. The road between Leonard Stanley and Frocester has just been resurfaced.

Youth Support There is a sum of £5k available for each division to support youth activities. I am keen to hear any ideas you may have.

Active Together This is to support healthy activities in the local areas, there is a small sum available of approx. £3.5k, I am happy to discuss any ideas.

Magistrates Court Closures

The Lord Chancellor and Secretary of State for Justice have identified 70 courts around the country which the Government looking to close following a public consultation. I am profoundly concerned that the Ministry of Justice has earmarked Stroud and Gloucester magistrates' for closure.

Should the Ministry of Justice proceed with it plan, it would leave Cheltenham as the sole magistrates court in Gloucestershire.

I believe that the closure of Gloucester and Stroud magistrates' courts will undermine the delivery of justice in the county. Furthermore I believe plans to close Gloucester magistrates' court will severely undermine existing proposals to create a justice centre and redevelop the Blackfriars quarter in Gloucester. Equally, this I believe that the proposal to close Stroud Magistrates' Court will mean some Gloucestershire residents will have to travel at least an hour to get to Cheltenham to receive justice.

Fracking in Stroud and the Forest of Dean

Following the launch of a Govt consultation on the above I have asked the following questions of GCC.

A) is the county going to respond to the consultation and if so what stance will it take , will there be an opportunity for cllrs to feed in their views ?

B) in terms of planning permission, will it be needed for the below proposals ? If so which body will determine the permission ? I believe it is the County but I may be wrong. If we wish to oppose what other avenues are open to us ?

C) have we as a county council agreed a position on fracking, if so what is it ? Or if we do not have one what process needs to be undertaken to get one eg motion at full council,

D) would appreciate any other info or advice you have on this controversial topic

Mankley Road
